Here are concrete actions you can take to save the USPS, protect our elections and our democracy, and ensure every eligible voter can cast a ballot that counts this year:

1 CALL YOUR SENATORS

Call your senators at **(928) 236-2402** and tell them they need to get back to work, extend the census deadlines, and provide emergency funding for USPS and for states to conduct safe and fair elections — money that was allocated by the House more than THREE months ago.

4 VOTE EARLY

Make a plan to vote EARLY, either in person or by mail. Again, go to vote.org to find out how to vote early in your state. Apply for your mail ballot NOW, fill it out, and send back using the methods your state allows. Don't wait!

7 CALL YOUR SECRETARY OF STATE OR COUNTY ELECTION OFFICIAL

Call your SOS or county election official (find info here: usvotefoundation.org/vote/eoddomestic.htm) and tell them they need to make secure drop boxes widely available and ensure that ballots postmarked on or by Election Day are counted within a reasonable number of days after (given USPS delays).

2 FILL OUT THE CENSUS

The Trump administration launched a years-long effort to suppress the count and rig the 2020 Census to reflect a less diverse and inaccurate portrait of America. Fight back and fill out the 2020 Census at 2020census.gov or call **844-330-2020**.

5 FOLLOW SOCIAL DISTANCING PROTOCOLS

Remember: If you vote in person, wear a mask and follow social distance protocols.

8 VOTING PROBLEMS? CALL ELECTION PROTECTION HOTLINE

If you encounter any problems with voting, call the nonpartisan Election Protection hotline that is run by the Lawyers' Committee for Civil Rights Under Law at **1-866-OUR-VOTE**.

3 REGISTER TO VOTE

Register to vote by going to vote.org. Even if you think you're already registered, double check your registration status to ensure it's updated and you're all set for the November election — fewer than 80 days away.

6 SIGN UP TO BE A POLL WORKER

Sign up to be a poll worker at powerthepolls.org/ASIV to keep polling places open and staffed.

9 HOLD POSTMASTER GENERAL DEJOY ACCOUNTABLE

Tell your Senators the USPS must restore decommissioned sorting machines and mailboxes that are important for managing the surge in mail expected during the election. Congress must provide \$25 billion to strengthen the U.S. Postal Service and pass legislation to end the overtime cap for USPS employees, reinstate "late and extra trips" that allow carriers to catch-up on backlogged deliveries; and end the sudden, suspicious, and disruptive operational changes like removing mailboxes and sorting machines put in place by Postmaster General DeJoy.
