WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:

A primary election is where parties decide who to nominate as their candidate in the general election, which takes place in November.

Nevada is a "closed primary" state. In order to vote in the primary election, voters must be registered with a political party (and can only vote for candidates running on their chosen party).

Unaffiliated or independent voters are not able to participate in the primary.

Who is eligible to vote in the primaries?

Any U.S. Citizen, at least 18 years old age, that has resided in Nevada and their county of residency for at least 30 days before the election is eligible to vote as long as they have not have been declared mentally incompetent by a court.

Where to find voting locations and dates?

Go to AndstilllVote.org to find your polling location and dates for voting.

Early voting begins on January 27 and runs through February 2, 2024.

How can I prepare?

You do not need to show ID when you vote in person in Nevada.

Check the federal ID requirements for FIRST-TIME VOTERS in a federal (President or Congressional) election in Nevada.
